### Summer School - Kat Yorks

- Kat introduced herself and did a quick overview about summer school. The high school classes will offer 4 credits. There will be a STEM based camp for middle schoolers. There were 551 students who joined summer school.
- Why do students take summer school courses? They will get extra free periods, advance in a subject area, have more focused learning and make rooms for more electives for the next school year.
- New this year US students sign up for summer school during regular course sign ups.
- Summer School Schedule: 6/22-7/31. 8:30-12:30pm
- Non-credit class options are available.
- Registration date: open on 2/3 for Lakeside families and close on 6/1. Open to public on 2/10.
- Note: We won't open WCC in the summer, lunch area in the library, microwave and sink.
- Bus pass Students who already have ORCA cards will have no additional cost for the summer school bus. Non-Lakeside students can purchase ORCA cards just for the summer.
- Teachers Classes will be taught by 50% Lakeside and 50% non-Lakeside teachers.
- Timing for buses arriving at 15 minutes before the class and leaving at 3:30pm.
- Library hours: 8am 4pm.

### **Head of School report** – Bernie Noe

- Bernie shared three stories.
  - o Bernie went to Calculus class 3 weeks ago. We want our students to be lifelong learners.
  - Mamma Mia school play. Bernie went on Saturday night and experience the joy of the audience. It was a great community event.
  - US Swim Senior night. Although we don't have Boys Diving team, we had 7 students try
    diving to help the team win tournaments, and it was so gratifying to see the support and
    team bonding around these boys.

- Skills, competence, and mindsets.
- We finished building schedules and staffing. We will pilot a new schedule. We worked with Challenge Success (group from Stanford University) to look into our schedules. The feedback we received included: They like the robust advising program, our activity periods, Wednesday/ Thursday longer blocks of time for dig some topics in a deeper level. Cons: Too many stacked up things on Friday and needing reasonable lunch time. Our new schedule is similar with MS schedule. A rotation of the days.
- Mamma Mia was fantastic to watch.
- Q: Do all US students take electives or not?
- A: We are trying hard to get their 1<sup>st</sup> choice. If possible, we will get one of their top 3 choices. We have 19 Art classes and 21 English electives.

### Middle School report - Elaine Christensen

- Develop curriculum for Personal Development, gender, identity, emotion management and leadership (8<sup>th</sup> grade). Message: Everyone who wants to make a community a better place is a leader. Students chose a person to profile.
- We tested the MS schedule a year ago with parent reps and 2 students advisor groups. Concerns: advisory group time. Class time change: 45 minutes to 60 minutes. Student will have only 6 classes in any day.
- Eight grade transition Summer school schedule is out with a series of lessons. You can do summer school, but you don't have to.
- Transition I am in the phase now for the transition. I have been keeping a dairy of every week. The new Director may come in spring to visit.
- We reviewed history Department with visiting classes and interviewing students.

## College Counseling Report – Ari Worthman

• 99% seniors did Early Process. 78% seniors were admitted to 1 school in December. 58% seniors applied ED and 49% got good news. 40% class will be done by the winter break.

- Changes are happening for college application. ACT announced changes about retesting and super scoring in fall. Colleges will accept those scores or not? Lots of unknown. We are trying to figure out for current juniors and sophomores.
- We will try a new program called the blind college fair. We will have 40 colleges coming to Lakeside. Students will speak with them without any materials in front of them. The 2<sup>nd</sup> part will be a normal college fair. It will be a great way for students to expand their horizon.
- Ari thanked PGA for a great evening for the book talk.
- Q: How quickly do you expect the answer will become clear after the ACT changes?
- A: Usually by late spring.
- Q: Colleges want you to give high scores for posting?
- A: Yes for the ranking systems. Surveys were mailed to admission offices to score their peers. The trend is about optional tests. But students are convinced that this is the trap.
