

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT INFORMATION

Summer at Lakeside Programs welcomes applications from international students. Please read the following information prior to registration and payment to ensure that a Summer at Lakeside Program is an appropriate fit for your student.

Travel Requirements

Students and their families are responsible for making travel arrangements and obtaining all travel documents (including visas) necessary to attend Summer School programs in an appropriate time frame. Due to the short period of time of our programs, international students typically obtain a short stay B-2 tourist visa (instead of a student visa) from the American Embassy or Consulate in their home country. Families should be aware of our 2024 Refund and Withdrawal Policy.

Medical Insurance

Please verify with your child's medical insurance provider that they cover travel to Washington state. If your child's insurance provider does not cover travel to Washington, we require that you purchase travel insurance for the duration of your child's camp/course through one of the following recommended vendors.

Language Expectation

Lakeside does not offer any support for English Language Learners (ELL). Students must be fluent in spoken and written English prior to registering. An interview to determine the student's level of English fluency is required. Once registration is complete, international students will be directed to sign up for a brief video-conference interview (via Zoom) with a Summer School Programs staff member in order to confirm fluency and acceptance into the program.

<u>Students applying for a High School for-credit course</u> also must complete the US course application for non-Lakeside students during the registration process. Transcripts and two teacher references are

required. All application materials must be translated into English or they will not be accepted.

Residence Expectation

Lakeside is not a boarding school, and we do not arrange for host families. All students must provide the name of the host or guardian they will be staying with during their participation in Summer at Lakeside programs. An international mailing address and phone number, as well as the mailing address and primary phone number of where the student will be staying while attending Lakeside School, should be provided during registration.

Applying to Lakeside Summer School (Gr.9-12 credit-earning classes)

Registration opens for Lakeside families, children of alumni, and Downtown School families February 12. Registration opens to the public February 13 via the portal on our Summer at Lakeside website: www.lakesideschool.org/summer. The summer school application is required for any non-Lakeside student who is registering for a High School for-credit class. This application is accessible via the registration website.
