

HOMWORK POLICY FOR ALL UPPER SCHOOL COURSES

Students who attend classes in the summer at Lakeside are expected to be in class every day, to be on time every day, and to be fully engaged in class. Courses that earn a semester or year-long credit have an intense homework load, and students can expect between 3-5 hours of homework per night.

In addition to being punctual and in class every day, students must also do all of the assigned homework. Because of the importance of all students being ready to fully participate in class, the following procedure will apply to all students:

If a student comes to class unprepared (did not attempt all homework), that student will be given a warning and will be expected to complete the missed assignment for the next day. The second time that a student comes to class unprepared, that student will be excused from class immediately and sent to the Summer School Programs director's office. The Summer School Programs director will decide on next steps, which may include dropping the student from the class, in which case no refund will be awarded to the family. For classes that award credit and record a grade, no credit will be given and a failing grade will be noted on the transcript.

Students and parents should be careful in how they plan their summer, reducing the number of activities that the student is involved with outside of class time. Activities like sports, music lessons, family and community time, should be measured with the high requirements of taking a summer course in mind.
